Talking Hamster



These talking friends repeat what you say & help with cause & effect of verbal communication. These can be used to target imitation skills, increased vocal play, turn-taking, etc.

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100 Words Book

Great for babies to practice verbal feedback with touch to learn categories such as pets, animals, food, colors, activities and more! **Bonus:** In both English & Spanish!




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Play Tent



This star light playhouse tent promotes focus on better play in a smaller space! Better focus means ability to listen, comprehend, and respond to social cues.

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Brown Bear Book, Brown Bear Board

Repetition that encourages children to fill in the final words. Great for learning animals, sounds as well as colors and simple directions.

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Hide-N-Go Moo Farm

This is a wonderful tool toy for imitating animal sounds, pretend play, turn-taking, spatial concepts, and more. It is super beneficial because it's multi-modal and kids enjoy using the manipulatives.

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Building Blocks



Great for beginning constructive play skills, counting, working on the concept of up/down, turn taking, colors and 2-word phrases!

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
Wooden Puzzles



Target problem-solving, requesting, turn-taking, labeling, identifying objects, part/whole concepts, commenting (It doesn't fit!).

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Lift-the-Flap Book



Great for building joint attention, cause/effect, object permanence, providing opportunities to model words or sounds and simple directions!

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Melissa & Doug Magnetic Animals


Great for labeling and receptive identification of animals, animal sounds and following two step commands (ex. put the cow on the table)! Perfect for using on the refrigerator or magnetic board.

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Noisy Farm Book



With touch, feel and hear elements, this board book encourages labeling and identifying animals, imitating sounds, following directions, early print concepts and more!

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Push & Go Cars

These fun and brightly colored cars are easy for a child to use while developing single word vocabulary and requests! Each car has a different animal and are great for early development.



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Play Velcro Food



This 60 pc set of play food is great for targeting early language goals, making requests, combining words together for phrases and item identification. These are super beneficial because the kids love cutting the foods!

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Pound a Ball Toy



Great for child who is at the cause-effect stage of play. Develops communication and vocabulary for target words such as (go, up, down, out) as well as requesting "me" to play e ball on top.

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Teach my Baby Learning Kit



It provides toys that also work on motor and visual skills such as blocks, finger puppets, and very basic puzzles. There is a short board book for each concept as well.

This kit has several different key concepts that young children learn throughout their first years, including animals, body parts, common items, etc.



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
Sit-To-Stand Learning Walker



This versatile activity toy grows with your little one as they reach new developmental skills. Targets pulling to stand, standing balance, and walking with support of hands. Comes in a variety of colors and options!

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Poke a Dot 10 Little Monkeys Book



This book takes a nursery rhyme and makes it more interactive in a book. Providing visuals when singing songs with children can help improve understanding of the concepts within a song. Children may pay more attention to the pictures when seeking out the circles to pop. Songs and repeated rhymes help create anticipation for children to imitate words or sounds.

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Whacky Ball



Similar to the pound a ball, this is another fun toy that teaches cause & effect as well as positional words like "put the ball in"!

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Pip Squigz



These increase strength, bilateral coordination & attention, while targeting fine motor coordination & hand strength. They are easily used with balance activities.

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Melissa & Doug Shape Sorting Cube



This toy is a great tool for working on concepts of "open" and "close", "in" and "out", colors, shapes, turn-taking, counting, and understanding the completion of a task. It is also an option for building two-word phrases ("yellow circle", "put in", "my turn").

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Press & Stay Sensory Blocks



Easy for any child to stack and develop pretend play skills as well as vocabulary (up, push, colors etc...). Eliminates frustration and encourages imagination! High contrast colors and interesting textures make it engaging and fun.

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Spin Again Toy



This bright and fun toy is great for eye hand coordination, fine motor and visual motor skill development and visually is fun and engaging!

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Mr. Potato Head



This classic toy is great with teaching body parts as well as communicating with others. Helps with producing different consonant /vowel words as well as other patterns of speech.

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
Measure Up Cups

These stacking cups not only provide stacking/nesting, they also provide numbers, patterns, animals and a plethora of information with each cup!



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Eye Found It Board Game



Game that works on visual perceptual skills needed for reading and turn taking and cooperation which are age appropriate social and self-regulation skills. It is also fun for the whole family!

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Learning Resources Gemstone Break Game

This fun game activity is great for bilateral coordination, modulation of force, color and shape identification!

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Pie Sorting Game



Works on a variety of sorting beyond just colors. In addition, it works on grasp coordination. As the child improves and gains skill you can add to this game by using different types of tongs, tweezers, etc

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Play Food Set

Group food into different categories (breakfast, lunch, vegetables, sweets). Pretend to make food while practicing sequencing skills. Work on the verbs "cook," "eat," and "give." Work on requesting. This list is also endless!



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Magnatiles



These fun magnetic tiles target early language skills. works on requesting, labeling colors, labeling shapes, creativity of making and constructing different things. Endless learning opportunities!

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Magnetic Dress Up People



Great for labeling clothing items, requesting, commenting with 2-3 word phrases and identifying pronouns. Fun open-ended play!

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Wooden Pattern Blocks



This fun game activity works on bilateral coordination, eye-hand coordination, and visual motor integration. This also challenges a child's patience when trying to accurately place blocks. What's great about this set is that the cards offer the answers on one side and the assembled picture on the other side so parents do not have to struggle as well!

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Pop the Pig Game

Good for turn taking, number recognition and matching. great for targeting following directions, color identification, reinforcer for targeting articulation sounds, and requesting in younger kids. It is super beneficial because the game is very engaging and fun!

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
Surprise Boxes



Fun game with surprises at every turn! Great for developing vocabulary and can be used in lots of ways - counting, colors, labeling, actions, etc!

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Quiet Loud Book



Helps teach the concepts of Quiet and Loud and how a child can think about their own volume when they are talking. There are several great books in this series.

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Water Beads



Sensory toy that can build on tactile tolerance and fine motor coordination skills especially when adding tools to retrieving specific colors or other toys placed into the mix.

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Big Feelings Pineapple

Teaches the most basic emotions. idea of using a toy to create a face for an emotion, then to see if the child can imitate the facial expression, as well as having a parent show an emotion and see if the child can guess it. Learning about emotions is a great way to help children be able to communicate about what's going on in their internal life as they develop speech

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Little Tikes Trampoline



Fun toy that targets increased leg strength, endurance, and coordination! Great way to burn some energy too!

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Building Blocks



Classic, toy that encourages following directions, turn-taking, shapes, you can build tall and short towers, you can work on patterns...red, blue, red, blue...what comes next?

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Wind-Up Robots (5 pc set)

Wind-up toys are excellent conversation-starters that will get kids talking. For children who are not bothered by the sound that the wind-up toy makes- these require an adult to wind-up, because young kids don't have the motor skills to wind up independently. This gives an opportunity to make a request.

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Fruit Salad Avalanche Game

AGES 5-7



This game works on fine motor coordination skills and problem solving. You have to use tweezers to work on pinch and grasp to pick fruit without causing an avalanche

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Gonge Riverstones



Jumping or stepping from stone to stone develops a child's confidence in their ability to judge distances. The layout can be changed to make a pathway more or less challenging. Targets dynamic balance & agility.

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Learning Resources Noodle Knockout Game

Great for fine motor control, tweezer skills to improve strength and positioning for pencil grasp, multi-step direction following, visual discrimination, and turn taking.




Great for fine motor dexterity skills, challenges eye hand coordination and visual perceptual skills in a fun and motivating way!

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
Mad Dragon

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Pencil Grasps


GREAT STOCKING STUFFER!

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Kanoodle Game




